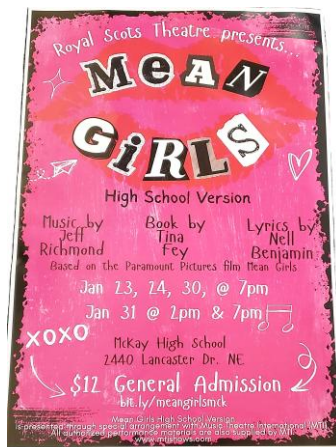

From Bronwyn: We ended November with a net gain of \$7,997.79. Payment in full of one annual pledge (\$8,500) and a partial payment of an annual pledge (\$3,600) were received. This leaves \$1,000 of an annual pledge outstanding. Overall, year to date is looking positive with a loss of \$3,242.10.

\$2,350 of gift cards for ODHS were purchased in November. Our annual budgeted expense for Misc. local spending is \$2,120. While the large ODHS spending throws off the expense vs. budget, it is matched to income amounts in budget line item #1003.

It is important to remember that we were gifted \$10,000 at the end of 2024 to put towards any deficit in 2025. These funds are sitting in our checking account and do not show in the 2025 budget.

Session Notes –December 17, 2025

Session met on December 17 via Zoom. Our primary order of business was discussion of pledged amounts and the proposed (estimated) budget. We decided to wait to approve the 2026 budget at our January 21 meeting, to be fairly certain of our estimated income. We base our Presbytery Partnership Giving pledge on a tithe of our estimated income, so that also plays into the calculations.

We celebrated the generosity of our congregation and their caring for youth in Marion County foster care, as we received a total of \$3,725 in cash and cards for workers to distribute among the youth.

We approved PC(USA) Special Offering dates for 2026 and dates for Communion. We continue to gather information about the cost and effectiveness of mounting a monitor on the south wall of the chancel instead of using a projector. Session will make the final decision when information is assembled.
