This is the first Sunday of Advent, when we prepare for the coming of the Christ Child. Our theme this year is the light that shines, not from afar, but rising among us. God breaks into human life not only at Bethlehem, but also here and now. Pastor Maggie will explore where and how we experience that in-breaking light.

budget/projected expenses for 2025 was \$106,795. 2026 could be the same or more, considering current economic realities. Your financial support is very much appreciated.

KEIZER COMMUNITY FOOD BANK The most efficient way to help food banks at this time is to provide cash donations so they can make bulk food purchases of most-needed items. Designate "KCFB" or "Food Bank" and we will route the money to KCFB. Volunteers are always needed to serve our hungry neighbors. KCFB had to apply a limit of 200 families at each opening (400 families per week) to make the available food last. From Bronwyn: This month shows a loss of \$1,682. Our last quarterly insurance payment took us over the annual line-item budget; all other expenses are in line with the budget. We are still waiting for two annual pledges for 2025 to be received.

SESSION NOTES - November 19, 2025

After opening with prayer, we acknowledged with joy this Advent marks the unofficial two year mark for Maggie's service here at JKPC, as she began serving as pulpit supply during Advent in 2023.

Bronwyn reported as of this meeting, we have received 11 pledges with a total of \$64,780, and are still waiting to hear from a few more people who have pledged in the past. Pledges from last year to this year are down approximately \$27,000. Bronwyn presented a draft budget that included a few small reductions but also included known increases in expenses. Our budget does not include a lot of "extras." We will see what pledges come in before the next meeting to determine what other resources we may need to access to balance the 2026 budget.

Joan relayed a request she received that we sing Happy Birthday during announcements on Birthday Sunday to include those who don't go into the social hall. After discussion, which considered that perhaps not all would appreciate the attention, along with and the potential disruption to worship flow, it was the will of session to not include the singing in worship but to celebrate more intentionally in the social hall after worship.

We accepted a quote from Action Drain to repair our sewer drain (roots had infested the cast iron sewer pipe) and install a cleanout in the repair area for \$1,981. The funds will come from our Capital Improvement and Maintenance fund (current balance \$26,697.45). The work was finished Nov. 20. Lee and Blair, with assistance from Mary Jo, replaced the women's ADA toilet and made necessary adjustments to the grab bar and plumbing hookup. Blair also replaced burned out lights in the sanctuary chandeliers. Thanks to all who helped get us together again!

We passed a motion approving Pastor Maggie's 2026 half-time (20 hrs/week) stated supply covenant, which included the presbytery-recommended 2.8% COLA increase and medical and dental coverage through Board of Pensions.

We calendared ordination and installation of officers (Jan. 11), annual congregation meeting (Feb. 15), and Officers Retreat (Feb 16). Annual reports are due by mid-January so the report can be available at the congregation meeting.

We closed with prayers for many and a sense of gratitude for this congregation, our fellowship, and the ways we share God's love in the community and beyond.
